

## **CHURCH BUSINESS (POLITY)**




Acts 1:15 In those days Peter stood up among the believers (a group numbering about a hundred and twenty)


Peter and the others believed they must organize themselves according the Scripture and the Holy Spirit.

Peter saw Apostolic leadership as divinely ordained and necessary to maintain. The Apostles had a ministry of preaching and prayer.


Apparently, Jesus instructed Peter to replace Judas or he had learned it from the Scriptures himself. We also need to follow Biblical patterns of organization.

**Psalm 109:8** This is an an interesting question: Does God cause the future or only know the future?


