

Pr 27:1  $\P$  Boast not thyself of to morrow; for thou knowest not what a day may bring forth.

About your future never boast because you not know what happen tomorrow.




Pr 27:2  $\P$  Let another man praise thee, and not thine own mouth; a stranger, and not thine own lips.

Never praise yourself, let other people praise you, strange agent, not your lips.




Pr 27:3  $\P$  A stone [is] heavy, and the sand weighty; but a fool's wrath [is] heavier than them both.

He stone that heavy and sand also, but anger of proud agent heavy more.




Pr 27:4 Wrath [is] cruel, and anger [is] outrageous; but who [is] able to stand before envy?
