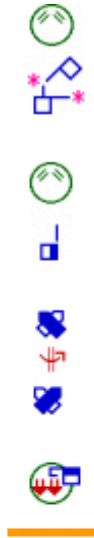


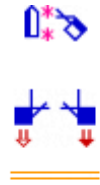
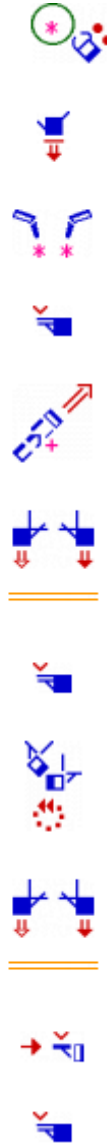
Pr 6:6 ¶ Go to the ant, thou sluggard; consider her ways, and be wise:

You lazy person, bug ant notice, learn ant ways then you become wise.



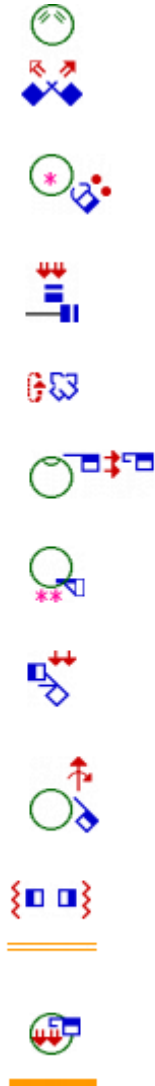
Pr 6:7 Which having no guide, overseer, or ruler,
