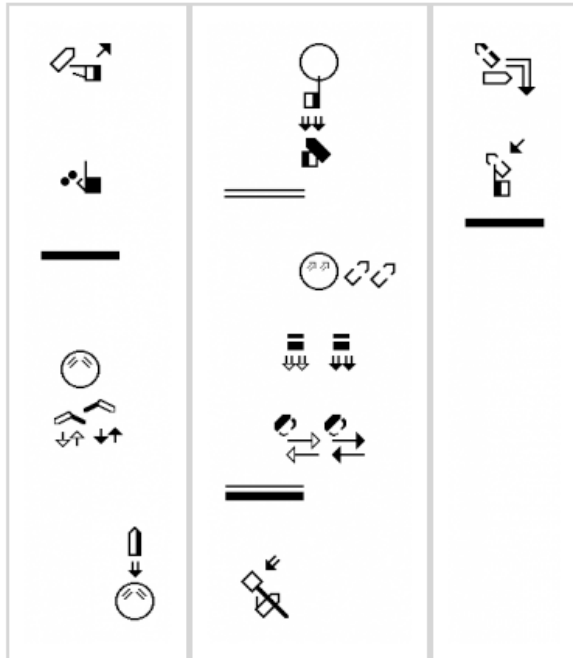


# FOR OUR BENEFIT AS WELL

Romans 4:21 And being fully persuaded that, what he had promised, he was able also to perform. (KJV)

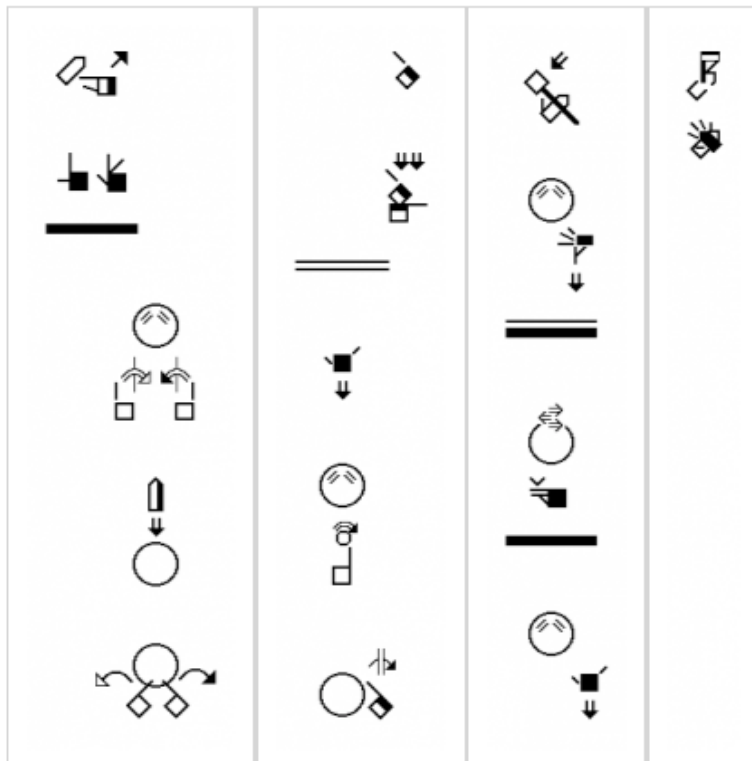
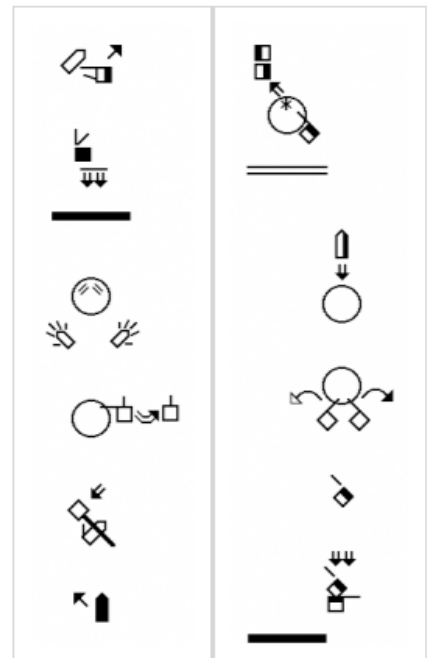


21. *Whatever God promises, He can do. Abraham (was) fully convinced.*

23. *When God declared him righteous, that only for Abraham's benefit? No. That recorded*

Why was the Bible written? Romans 15:4, 1 Corinthians 10:11

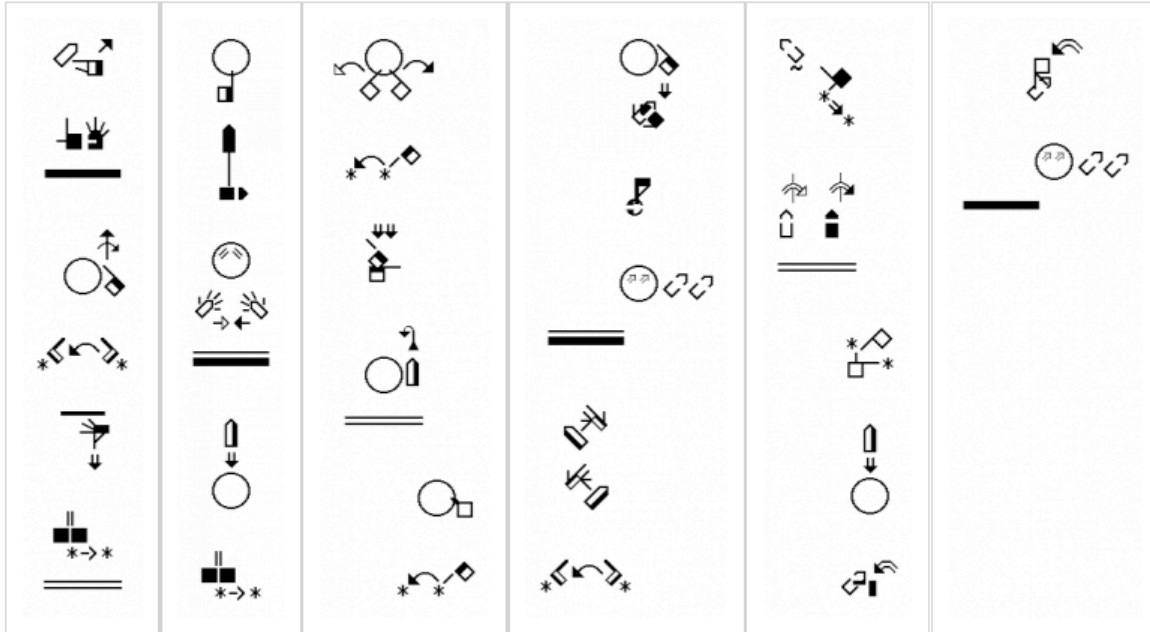
When I want to learn how to do something I go to the internet.

Do you go to the Deaf, the Hearing or to the Word of God?

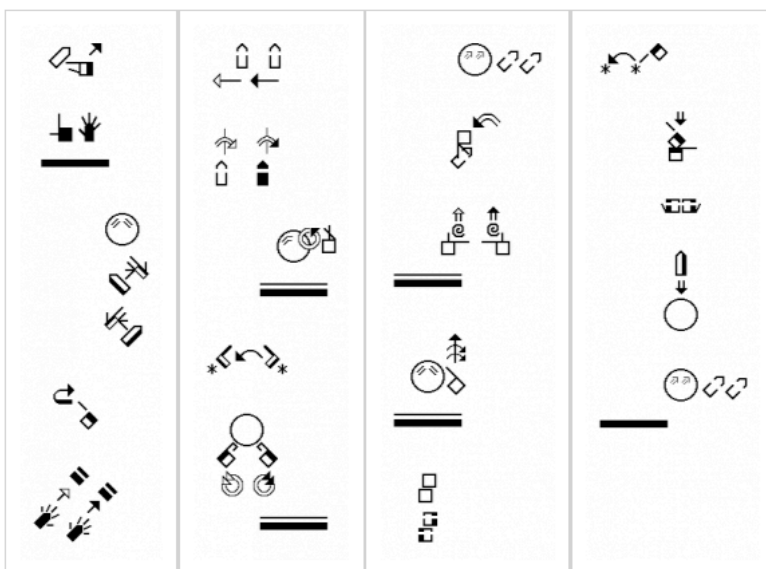
**24 But for us also, to whom it shall be imputed, if we believe on him that raised up Jesus our Lord from the dead;(KJV)**

*24. for our benefit also, (the) promise what? God also declares us righteous will, if we believe in Him. Jesus our Lord died, then God raised Him (Jesus).*

**25 Who was delivered for our offenses, and was raised again for our justification. (KJV)**



**25. Jesus he (was) given (to) death reason (because), (of) our sins. He resurrected (to) life, for? (what for) make us right with God He.**

Very often a person might not agree with a particular law. In America we have a right of appeal. If that law is found constitutional their is no redress. Neither is there any redress for someone who breaks God’s Law.
