


Jesus Christ is the one to come.


Still, everyone died -from the time of Adam

representation of Christ,

The effect of grace is greater than the effect of Adam's sin.


Jesus could not have saved us if he was not fully human.

But there is a great difference between Adam's sin and God's gracious gift. For the sin of this one man. Adam. brought death to many. But even greater is God's wonderful grace and his aift of forgiveness to many through this other man, Jesus Christ.

16 And not as it was by one that sinned, so is the gift: for the judgment was by one to condemnation, but the free gift is of many offences unto justification.



17 For if by one man's offence death reigned by one; much more they which receive abundance of grace and of the gift of righteousness shall reign in life by one, Jesus Christ.)



One man's sin: condemnation. Free gift: justification.

For one person to destroy something is believable but for one person to fix it is incredible.)

And the result of God's gracious gift is very different from the result of that one man's sin. For Adam's sin led to condemnation, but God's free gift leads to our being made right with God, even though we are guilty of many sins.

One man: Abundance of grace
