
WHY DO PEOPLE STILL SIN?

Romans 6:10 For in that he died, he died unto sin once: but in that he liveth, he liveth unto God.



11 Likewise reckon ye also yourselves to be dead indeed unto sin, but alive unto God through Jesus Christ our Lord.

12 Let not sin therefore reign in your mortal body, that ye should obey it in the lusts thereof.



"Reckon" think, consider, conclude, credit, the opposite of feeling. (My boss told me I had to work mid-nights. I feared him; I felt he had a right; but I had a Union book.) God's Book says that Sin has no authority over me, but I must speak up, pray, and exercise my rights.
