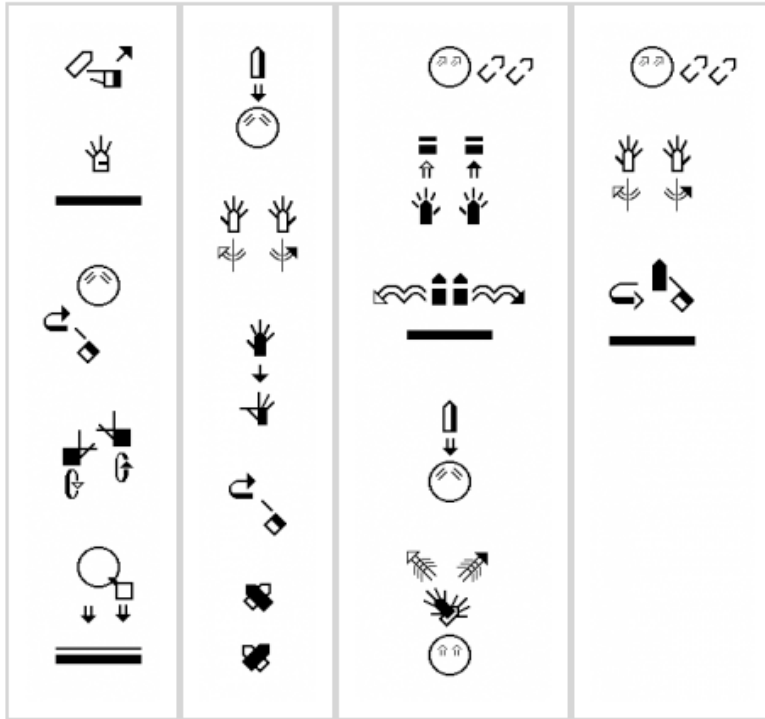

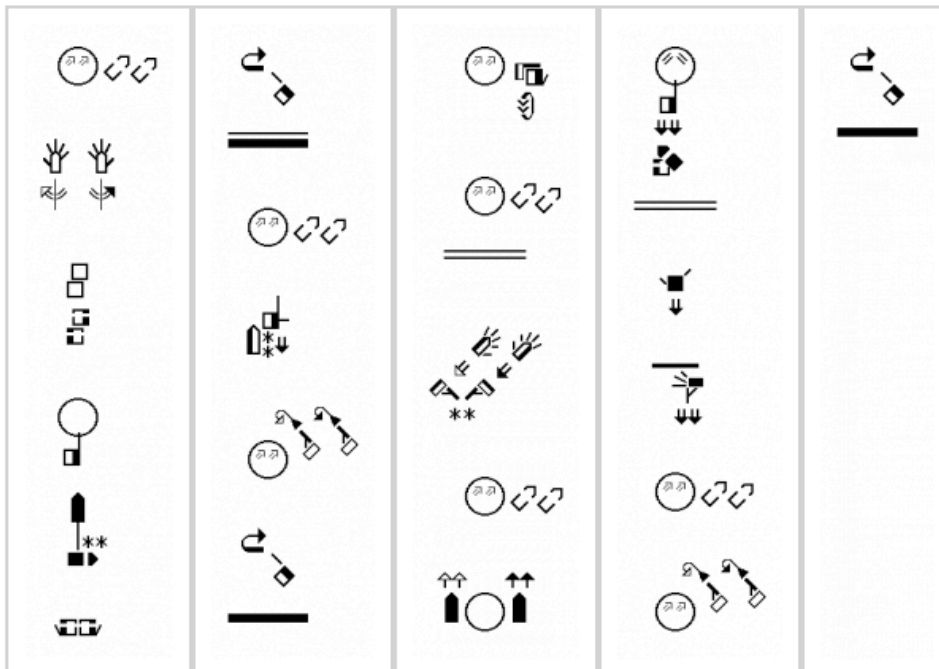


4 a,b They are the people of Israel, chosen to be God's adopted children. God revealed his glory to them.

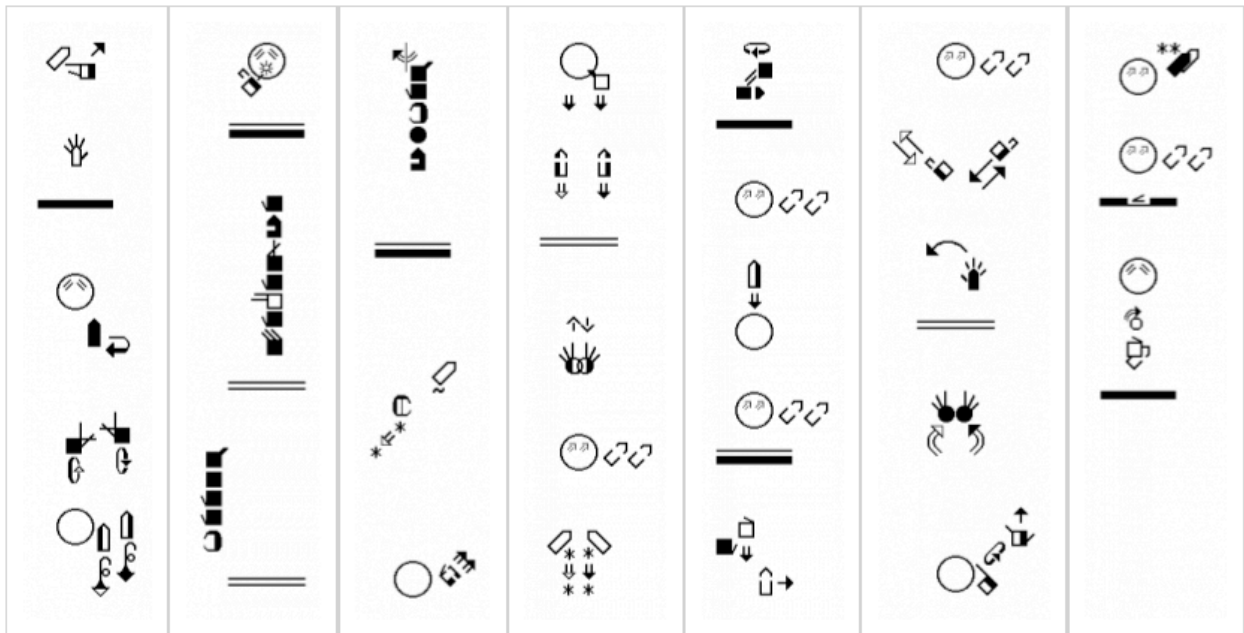
A large part of the Bible is about the Israelites.

People are not going to be saved for one reason: their refusal to accept Jesus Christ as the only way. (Acts 4:12)

(III.) Imagine someone in an emergency situation refusing to use the only means possible to save them. That person does not realize his precarious predicament, he doesn't know it is possible to be saved, or he is relying on some other resource. It is our duty to inform people that they are in an emergency situation and that the only way to be saved is through Jesus Christ.
